



### WHAT'S COVERED IN THESE GUIDELINES?

## This set of guidelines list the various ways in which you can enter dates into the date field.

The date field is an optional field which is used to indicate the time period covered by the content on a page (for example, a page containing photos from the 1940s).

You can enter the date in a wide variety of formats (e.g. 1964, 3rd March 1960, 3/3/1960, c.1985). When you save the post, the website software will try and interpret your date into a machine-readable 'interpreted date' – see the examples below. This 'interpreted date' will be used in the date search facility on the site.

The guidelines below cover:

- 1. Valid ways of entering dates
- 2. Invalid ways of entering dates
- 3. What to do if a date is being interpreted incorrectly

### 1: VALID WAYS OF ENTERING DATES

This list shows the different ways you can enter dates into the date field. The second column shows how the date will be interpreted by the software.

12/02/1983 = 12/02/1983

12 Feb 1983 = 12/02/1983

12 February 1983 = 12/02/1983

12th February 1983 = 12/02/1983

Thursday, 12th February 1983 = 12/02/1983

02/1983 = 01/02/1983-28/02/1983

Feb 1983 = 01/02/1983-28/02/1983

February 1983 = 01/02/1983-28/02/1983

1983 = 01/01/1983-31/12/1983

?1983 = 01/01/1983-31/12/1983

(simply ignores the question mark)

c.1983 = 01/01/1978-31/12/1988

(5 years either side)

c 1983 = 01/01/1978-31/12/1988

circa 1983 = 01/01/1978-31/12/1988

c. 02/1983 = 01/11/1982-28/05/1983

(i.e. 3 months either side)

c 02/1983 = 01/11/1982-28/05/1983

circa 02/1983 = 01/11/1982-28/05/1983

c Feb 1983 = 01/11/1982-28/05/1983

circa February 1983 = 01/11/1982-28/05/1983

1980s = 01/01/1980-31/12/1989

10/02/1983-20/02/1983 = 10/02/1983-20/02/1983

10 February 1983-20 February 1983 = 10/02/1983-20/02/1983

January 1983 – March 1983 = 01/01/1983-31/03/1983

1982-1984 = 01/01/1982-31/12/1984

c.1982-c.1984 = 01/01/1977-31/12/1989

c.1983-1990 = 01/01/1978-31/12/1990

(i.e. takes the first year as a circa date

and the second as exact)

1982-83 = 01/01/1982 and 31/12/1983

19th century = 01/01/1800 and 31/12/1899

#### 2: INVALID WAYS OF ENTERING DATES

The main cause of problems is entering date ranges, in which the first date is incomplete: for example 'January-February 1983' instead of 'January 1998-February 1983'.

The following dates should be corrected as shown:

20 March 75 SHOULD BE 20 March 1975

January – February 1983 SHOULD BE January 1983 – February 1983

1982-3 SHOULD BE 1982 - 1983

12-13 February 1983 SHOULD BE 12 February 1983 – 13 February 1983

# 3: WHAT TO DO IF A DATE IS BEING INTERPRETED INCORRECTLY

If you enter a date, and then see – after saving the post – that the interpreted date is incorrect, you should:

- 1. Check whether you have used any date expressions which the software can't be expected to understand (e.g. Summer term, 1953)
- 2. Check your dates are complete (e.g. 1975 not 75). See the examples above.
