### FUNERAL OF THOMAS HOGAN.

The remains of Thomas Hogan—who died in the Mater on Friday last, as the result of wounds received during the shooting in Croke Park—were removed yesterday morning from St. Joseph's Church, Berkeley st., to Kingsbridge Railway station.

Deceased was a native of Tankardstown, Kilmallock, Co. Limerick.

### TOM HOGAN'S BURIAL.

The funeral of Mr. Thomas Hogan, who died in the Mater Hospital from the effects of wounds received at Croke Park on November 21, took place on Monday at Tankardstown, Kilmallock, and was attended by a large number of people. He was a native of Kilmallock, but had been in business in Dublin for some time past. The deceased was well known in Gaelic circles in the city, being a prominent member of the Rapparee Hurling Club, and his early demise under such tragic circumstances occasioned much grief, not alone amongst the immediate members of his family, but amongst his fellow-Gaels in Dublin and Limerick, with whom he was a great favourite. At a specially convened meeting of the Rapparee H.O. the following vote of condolence was passed:—"That we, the members of the Rapparee Hurling Club, tender our deepest sympathy with the family and relatives of the late Thomas Hogan, an esteemed member of our club."
