LATE VERY REV. DEAN LYNCH.

Very Rev. Dean Thomas Lynch, P.P., V.F., Bega. Australia, who died at a private hospital in Sydney recently, was brother of the late General Liam Lynch, Chief of Staff, I.R.A., and was a member of a well-known farming family resident at Anglesboro, County Limerick.

Possessed of outstanding ability and energy he accomplished great work in church building on the Australian Mission. He received his early education at Anglesboro National School and later went to Mount Melleray and St. Colman's College, Fermoy completing his studies at St. Patrick's College, Thurles, where he was ordained in June. 1921. That year he went on the Australian Mission. He enjoyed his first homecoming in 1933 and in 1947 celebrated his Silver Jubitee.
